

About the program

Over 52% of motorcycle accidents will result in serious injury or fatality. EMS providers must be prepared to assess the accident scene, prevent rescuer injury and assess and manage the injured rider.

Are you prepared to manage motorcycle trauma? Is your service ready to respond to motorcycle accidents? The Two Wheel Trauma Program will provide you with the tools you need to manage motorcycle trauma and make a difference in the care and transportation of the injured rider.

Program Goal

Our goal is simple, to enhance the survival rate for the injured rider(s) of bicycles, motorcycles, ATV's, mopeds, snowmobiles and other vehicles of similar design and to reduce the potential for rescuer injury.

Objectives

At the conclusion of the program the participant shall:

- 1) Identify the following motorcycle parts and discuss hazards & injury potential: Exhaust pipes, Kill switches, Batteries, Radiators, Primaries, Fuel switches, Windshields, Proper & improper lift points
- 2) Approach the scene safely observing for hazards and mechanism of injury.
- 3) Discuss principals for people management at the accident scene.
- 4) Consider the possibility of hypothermia for all injured, in all types of weather.
- 5) Properly handle and manage avulsed and amputated parts.
- 6) Properly categorize and treat thermal, electrical, chemical and friction burns.
- 7) Explain the principles of assessment and properly triage injured riders.
- 8) Discuss appropriate treatment and management guidelines.
- 9) Identify common & life threatening potential of injuries.
- 10) Effectively remove helmets without jeopardizing the cervical spine.
- 11) Discuss patient immobilization techniques.

Who should attend?

First Responders, EMT-Basics, EMT-Intermediates, Paramedics, Paramedic Specialists, RN's, firefighters, Law Enforcement and Emergency Department personnel.
